Class contributions toward an organization chart

The Commonwealth (Everett, WA)

"The work of The Commonwealth will not be done until the day the true commonwealth in which all are in possession of that which is truly their own is established. The Commonwealth will continue to call upon the people early and late, to rise and claim that which is their own." Thus proclaimed the Everett Commonwealth at its debut on February 4, 1911.

First edited by O.L. Anderson, this four-column, eight-page weekly entered into the fractious debates typical of the Washington State's multiplying Socialist factions. Editors came and went in quick succession, the most notable being Anna Agnes Maley (September 1911-May 1912). Having written for one of the most important Socialist periodicals in the country----The Appeal to Reason, Maley had made her mark nationally through her support for political and women's rights before coming to Washington State. The Commowellth's coverage of notable national and international events expanded under her hand, without a reduction in the detailed reports on Socialist activities around the state.

With the Presidential election of 1912 on the horizon and with Eugene V. Debs leading the Socialist ticket, Maley left the paper in order to run for governor, the first woman and first Socialist to do so in the state. The Commonwealth covered the run-up to the election in considerable depth, publishing Debs' speech in Everett along with other campaign news. Maley came in third in the race for governor, taking a respectable 12 percent of the vote.

The Commonwealth continued under six more editors, including Maynard Shipley, a graduate of Stanford University and former editor of the World of Oakland, California-- the oldest Socialist newspaper on the West Coast. Believing that the constant squabbling among factions damaged the Socialist cause, Shipley refused to publish stories about the infighting. He tried to maintain high standards of journalism in the Commonwealth, increasing the use of photographs and the depth of news coverage.

Several significant figures in the national and international Socialist movement contributed to the *Commonwealth* including Gordon Nye, Fred D. Warren, George D. Herron, and Debs himself. The paper advocated strongly for freedom of expression, universal suffrage, industrial unionism, and the single tax. It also supported the Industrial Workers of the World and helped the Washington State Socialist Party to push organized labor toward the left. Despite constant efforts to increase its subscription base, the paper struggled financially and went into receivership in March 1914. The final issue of the *Commonwealth* appendent on April 9, 1914, and the paper's assets were sold to the Socialist Party of Snohomish County. The *Commonwealth* solent but had no apper, the <u>Washington Socialist</u>.






SUMMARY Define the availability of a new final report, "Evaluating the Potential Safety Benefits of Electronic Hours-of-Service Recorders." The study quantitatively evaluated whether trucks equipped with Electronic Hours-of-Service Recorders (EHSRs) have a lower (or higher) crash and hours-of-service (HOS) violation rate than those without EHSRs. The safety benefits of EHSRs were quantitatively evaluated by comparing the crash risk for two exposure groups (i.e., EHSRs were considered to improve safety if the trucks with EHSRs showed a lower crash risk than trucks without EHSRs). For this project, EHSRs were defined as any device that electronically records drivers' HOS. The study is an effort to further quantify the safety benefits of electronic logging devices (ELDs) and provides results that are consistent with the Agency's estimates of safety

4.3 FUTURE RESEARCH

Although the current study involved the collection of comprehensive truck, carrier, crash, and HOS violation information, the carrier-collected data still rely on retrospective crash reconstruction. This information can be erroneous for a variety of reasons, such as eyewitness recall, limited pre-crash information, and unwillingness to report information for fear of prosecution, termination, or reprimand. A video-based naturalistic truck study would address these concerns. Many trucks would need to be involved to obtain the necessary number of crashes to assess the efficacy of EHSRs. The current study design could be expanded to include a larger, more representative sample. Although there were 224,034 truck-years, 82,943 crashes, and 970 HOS violations in the data set, the number of fatigue-related crashes represented a small portion of these (0.44 percent and 15.3 percent, respectively). Furthermore, analyses could be rerun using HOS violations over a longer period of time (as only the previous 2 years' worth of HOS violations were collected for the current study) using FMCSA's archived data. Future studies could also gather driver-based assessment of EHSRs through surveys or focus groups. Finally, the majority of participating carriers in the current study were large, for-hire carriers. An additional study with small-to-medium carriers (i.e., carriers with less than 250 power units) should be performed.

My name is Diane Smith, I have been driving 9 years with a commercial license. I have always had a class A license since my beginning my career. I have operated all combo vehicles including passenger buses. I have operated tanker and van and have a valid hazmat endorsement.

I have experience preparing paper logs and have used an electronic log system for roughly 6 months. Other than my last 6 months, I have been specifically paper logging. The issues surrounding paper logs involved frequent pushback from previous employers encouraging me to run over hours. Employers have suggested to avoid tolls and weigh stations if I couldn't match it too my logs while encouraging I continue to make the delivery. I would also have loads dispatched on me that they knew there was no legal way to complete. The same company would encourage speeding and other means of log falsification. I had a lot of problems not knowing what town to flag when I took breaks or made stops. I no longer have to worry with electronic logs on locations.

Also, with electronic logs I feel better prepared for the day. I know exactly how many hours I have available and used for the week. I am in favor of the proposed ruling because I don't want to see fatigued driving play a factor in my safety. I like the communication features on my electronic logging device. It helps with my routing and day to day planning. It betters the communication between myself and my dispatch






